Use of English

1. Verbs

- Simple, perfect and continuous aspect
- Narrative tenses: past simple, past continuous, past perfect simple, past perfect continuous, used to and would + infinitive.
- State verbs
- Future forms: present continuous with future meaning, present simple with future meaning, be going to + infinitive, will + infinitive, future continuous, future perfect and future in the past. Future time expressions.
- Modal verbs: prohibition, necessity, lack of necessity, advice, ability, and speculation and deduction (present and past).
- Reported speech: direct and indirect speech, backshift, reporting statements, negative sentences, questions and requests, reporting verbs, impersonal reporting verbs
- Passive voice
- Hypothetical meaning: wish / if only, it is high time, would rather, as if /as though
- Verb patterns: -ing, infinitive with to, infinitive without to, verbs with two patterns

2. Clauses

- Relative clauses: defining and non-defining relative clauses. Prepositions in relative clauses.
- Participle clauses: present participle clause and past participle clauses
- Conditional clauses: zero, first, second, third and mixed conditionals. Alternatives to “if”.

3. Coherence and Cohesion: substitution, ellipsis, reference and conjunctions (contrast, reason and result, give extra information)

4. Emphasis: inversion in conditional sentences, negative inversion, cleft sentences with “what” and “it”, and fronting

5. Adjectives and Adverbs: -ing and -ed adjectives, modifying adverbs, comparing (regular and irregular comparative and superlative forms), “like” in comparisons, intensifiers and modifiers.

6. Vocabulary: word building: prefixes (opposites and false opposites), suffixes for nouns, verbs, adjectives and adverbs, expressions with “room”, “space”, “brain”, “mind” and “matter”, verb/noun collocations, collocations with “go”, and multi-part verbs
